This year sees the 50th annual South Stoke and Midford Village Show. This early-autumn highlight, where villagers and their families can get together, has taken place each year since it was founded in the seventies by Joan Carey-Jones. There is plenty to enjoy about this traditional show, whether you choose to compete or just come along to enjoy viewing the many exhibits. If you haven't been before this is a prime opportunity for you to take part - there are 56 different ways to show off your skills!

There are the usual classes for flowers, fruit, vegetables, cookery, photography and handicrafts with special classes just for the under twelves! There are fifteen cups to be won, including the Silver Jubilee Cup for the family with the highest points, so there is something for everyone to share and enjoy!

As ever the photography competition has themes, and this year we have decided to make them the same for both the adult and children's categories. They are as follows:

- Portrait
- Landscape
- Golden

This year you will see new categories including the Creative Writing category for both adults and children. We are all looking forward to seeing plenty of your ideas!

There is a class for everyone! Adults may enter classes 1 to 46. For each adult class there is a first prize of £2 and a second prize of £1.

Entries cost £1 each per class, and all proceeds will go to the South Stoke Parish Hall Appeal.

The Junior section is for children aged 12 or under, classes 47 to 56. Entries in any of these classes is 50p, so why not just have a go? The prizes are £1.00 for first class and 50p for second class.

***To exhibit at the show, please fill out the included entry form for each individual entrant and return, with the appropriate entry fee enclosed, to The Packhorse Inn, where there will be a post-box, no later than 9pm on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> August.***

Please bring your exhibits to the village hall to 'stage' them on the morning of the show between 9:00am and 11:00am.

If you would simply like to browse the exhibition and meet your neighbours over tea and cake, the doors will re-open to visitors at 2:30pm (entry £2 for adults, free for 12 and under, refreshments included). As this is our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, a glass of fizz will be available for a donation. Cups will be presented at 3:45pm, swiftly followed by an auction of selected exhibits. All are welcome!

Last year's cups must be returned cleaned and polished, by 6pm on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2024 to Sue at The Old School House or Roz at Southstoke Hall, to prepare for this year's show.

## Show Rules

1. The entry fee is £1 per class, junior classes (12 or under) are 50p.
2. Entry forms must be delivered to The Packhorse Inn not later than 9pm on the Thursday before the show (29<sup>th</sup> August 2024).
3. Late entries may be refused for space reasons (although refusals are rare).
4. Everyone with a strong connection to South Stoke and Midford may enter the Show, specifically: residents (or ex-residents) of South Stoke and Midford villages and their close relatives who either live locally or who are visiting on the day of the Show; Bath residents who worship at the Church of St James, South Stoke; those who work in the village; those who take part in South Stoke social activities; regulars of the Packhorse Inn.
5. All exhibits must have been the property of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the Show except for flower arrangements, cakes, jams and pickles.
6. **No exhibitor may make more than one entry in any class.**
7. Exhibits must be staged between 9.00am and 11.00am on the day of the Show.
8. All exhibitors must leave the hall by 11.00am to allow judging to commence.
9. Exhibitors and the general public will be admitted after judging at 2.30pm. Cups will be presented at 3.45pm. Auction of produce at 4.00pm.
10. Exhibitors should not remove their exhibits until after the presentation of cups.
11. The organisers will be grateful for exhibits to be left to be auctioned. Stickers indicating exhibits not for sale will be available at the hall.

12. Prize money will be distributed after the auction.
13. All exhibitors must provide their own vases, bowls, plates or other receptacles.
14. The organisers will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to exhibits, but every reasonable care will be taken.
15. Exhibitors must not move other exhibits. The Stewards must be informed if there is insufficient space for staging. The Stewards reserve the right to make space adjustments to resolve overcrowding.
16. For classes with six or more entries, the judge may allocate an additional Highly Commended award if quality justifies.
17. Where there are three or less entries in any class, the judge may withhold either or both prize awards if the quality of exhibits is inadequate.
18. In respect of the cups for best entries, the judges will be asked to nominate the best entries in each of the relevant sections.
19. In calculating the award of the Fred Daw Shield and Silver Jubilee, Hignett, and Cowley Cups: a First Prize shall count 5 points, a Second Prize 3 points, and a Highly Commended award 1 point.
20. If the winner of the Fred Daw Shield or the Silver Jubilee Cup has the highest total of points, the trophy will be awarded to the entrant with the next highest score.
21. Any cash prizes not collected by the Wednesday after the show will be donated to the South Stoke Parish Hall Appeal.
22. No cheating!
23. The judges' decisions will be final.

# Competition Classes

## Flower section

1. Single rose, specimen, one bloom.
2. Spray of roses, one stem, any variety.
3. Bowl of roses, not more than 12 stems, own foliage, any variety or varieties.
4. Annuals or perennials, 3 stems of the same variety.
5. Vase of garden flowers (largest variety).
6. Fuchsias, 3 stems, one variety.

## Flower Arrangement section

7. Arrangement of garden herbs.
8. A gentleman's buttonhole.
9. Flower arrangement, any container, less than 24" in any direction.
10. Miniature flower arrangement, any container, less than 5" in any direction.

## Special Anniversary category

11. The tallest sunflower. Presented either cut or in a pot.  
Total height from base of stem to highest point of bloom.

## **Fruit section**

12. Cooking apples, 5 in number.
13. Dessert apples, 5 in number.
14. Pears, 5 in number.
15. Dish of plums, damsons or figs.
16. Dish of edible berries.

## **Vegetable section**

17. Tomatoes, 5 in number.
18. Cherry tomatoes, 7 in number.
19. Potatoes, 6 in number.
20. Onions or garlic, 3 in number.
21. French or runner beans, 6 in number.
22. Cucumber, 1 in number.
23. Beetroot, 3 in number, trim to 3" approx.
24. Carrots, 3 in number, trim to 3" approx.
25. Courgettes, 2 in number, less than 8" long.
26. Longest runner bean.
27. Gourds or squash.
28. Curiosity vegetable.



## **Domestic section**

29. Decorated cake –50<sup>th</sup> anniversary themed.
30. Victoria sandwich, 6oz butter or margarine, 6oz castor sugar, 3 eggs, 6oz self-raising flour, cook in two 7” sandwich cake tins, joined with raspberry jam, **undecorated.**
31. A “free-from” bake - no dairy and/or gluten (please label!)
32. Six plain scones.
33. Bread, 1lb loaf (using 1lb flour), any variety.
34. Six pieces of flapjack.
35. Jam or jelly, one pot any variety.
36. Chutney or relish, one pot, any variety.
37. Marmalade, one pot, any variety.
38. Home-made beer, cider, wine or spirits, bottled.

## **Art and Craft section**

39. Photograph “Portrait”.
40. Photograph “Landscape”.
41. Photograph “Golden”.
42. 2D art, not bigger than A1, unframed.
43. 3D art and craft, table space allowed 40cm x 40cm.
44. Papercraft, e.g. quilling, origami, collage, decolletage.
45. Needlecraft, e.g. embroidery, knitting, crochet, sewing.
46. Creative writing, e.g. poetry, haiku, limerick, prose with a max 200 words. Theme – Golden.

## **Junior section (for entrants 12 years or under)**

47. Design a bee friendly garden. (Illustration or model accepted)
48. Junior bake-off – decorated home-made cake or biscuits.
49. Painting or drawing.
50. Handicraft (not a kit), table space allowed 40cm x 40cm.
51. Flower arrangement, in a jam jar.
52. Vegetable creation – a model made from vegetables!
53. Photograph unmounted - “Portrait”, “Landscape” or “Golden” not larger than A5 size, taken without help.
54. Standard 2” matchbox with greatest number of different articles (Provide list with exhibit).
55. Colouring – use the picture provided in this programme.
56. Creative writing, e.g. poetry, haiku, limerick, prose with a maximum of 200 words. Theme – Golden. Entries may be written by hand or on a computer. They may also be illustrated.
